## **'The Beast from the East'**

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The beast from the east is the talk of the town, in fact of the whole country. Aberdeen has been largely spared the chaos other parts of the country have endured. We were very concerned to hear of Judy Laing's parents and sister's family stranded on the M80 for several hours though delighted to hear of their eventual arrival home. Such stories could be multiplied.

In the face of such extreme weather there are three key instructions we ignore at our peril; be informed, take heed, and be prepared. We all have access to weather forecasts, we all hear the solemn warnings from Traffic Scotland and we're all just about to put that blanket and supplies in the car but – often – we still get caught out.

The beast from the east will come and go, hopefully back to Siberia never to return.

The Bible also speaks of a day coming that we must all be prepared for, a day when the '*Judge of all the earth*' shall come and judge the living and the dead (for the avoidance of doubt that includes you and me). Curiously the same three instructions hold true in respect of that day; be informed, take heed, and be prepared.

*Be informed* – The Bible does not inform us of the day or hour but it does make clear that it could be *any* day or hour. That's all we need to know.

*Take heed* – We often treat warnings regarding the Judgment Day in the same way as we treat the eccentric evangelists with their sandwich boards proclaiming the end is nigh; just a bit of a joke. But it's no joke. Jesus is coming and he is coming to judge the world.

*Be prepared* – This may seem odd but what you need in the light of this coming day is also a blanket. Not a blanket to protect you from the snow but a blanket of grace that clothes you with the righteousness of Christ. What does that mean in ordinary English? It means that the only way to be prepared for the coming of Christ is to be trusting in Christ and so clothed in the righteousness of Christ. Thus prepared you can look forward on that day to the verdict '*... guiltless and perfect in Christ*'.

## Snagging Issues

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'*Snagging*' was a new word I learnt in the context of the refurbishment of our building. It's the word that describes bits and bobs of the work that aren't quite right and still need tweaking or fixing. Let me comment on three of these of which, strictly speaking, only the first is a snagging issue and the other two are new jobs agreed on subsequent to the handover of the building.

**The lift** – The lift has not been working for several weeks and this continues to be a source of understandable frustration and bemusement to many. Why the long delay? The company that installed the lift have been to try and resolve the problem on more than one occasion but finally established that they needed a piece of kit (not very technical language I'm afraid) that could only be sourced in Italy. We are assured that this has now been secured and we expect a prompt resolution. Please accept the apologies of the Deacons' Court on this one.

**Acoustic panels in the large hall** – On our return to the building it became clear that the noise levels in the large hall were a real problem; to the extent that some folks simply found they could not come down for tea and coffee. We contracted a sound engineer to propose a solution and this has resulted in the decision to install a number of acoustic panels on the walls around the large hall. We have identified and contracted a suitable joiner for the installation of the panels but this may still take a few weeks; largely due to the time lag between ordering and delivery of the panels. We're getting there on this one.

**Signage and notice-boards** – This was not part of the original specification of work given to the contractor and so we have had to pursue this subsequent to our return to the building. In order to ensure that the signage was in keeping with the design (exterior and interior) of the building we contracted the architects who worked on the project to advise and design suitable signage and noticeboards. This has now happened and the Deacons' Court have selected the preferred option. A further delay has been the time required to secure planning permission but this is also now in course and we look forward to in the near future (suitably vague!) having a sign and noticeboards outside (in fact there will be signs at both the Rosemount Viaduct and Stevenson Street levels).

## **Bon Accord People**

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Thanks to Iain Smith who is answering our questions this month...

### ***Please tell us a little about yourself. Where are you from [and what brought you to Aberdeen]?***

Ness, Isle of Lewis. The beginning to life every child deserves, but few are fortunate enough to enjoy. Life in this Eden-esque utopia was tragically cut short. A few years in Inverness were followed by a move to Aberdeen in 2000. We definitely weren't in Ness anymore. Apart from a short stint in Canada, this has been home since. An unsuccessful university career has been blamed on (a) football manager and/or (b) pool. Then I met Rebecca. The last 3 years have been a blur of love, joy, Thai food and the A96. However, without the appropriate time dedicated to them, I've become significantly poorer at both football manager and pool. You win some, you lose some.

### ***What does a typical day look like for you?***

Alarms go at 6:45, I tend not to bother with the snooze function and just switch them off entirely and fall back asleep. A hard days grind at the coalface (sitting at a computer, drawing boats and drinking coffee) is followed by the almost daily realisation that I now have to feed myself. This is still a work in progress - there's good days and bad days - but I've only made Rebecca sick once so we're on the right track.

### ***How did you become part of Bon Accord?***

When we moved to Aberdeen in 2000, we started coming to Bon Accord as a family. You'll have to ask my parents (in the next issue, please) why, but it has always felt like home to us.

### ***Please describe how you became a Christian?***

I asked Christ into my life when I was 12. Being brought up in a Christ-centred home and in the church, I don't remember a time I didn't believe in God, and that the Bible was his word. But it was then that I realised I had to ask Christ into my life.

### ***How do you try to keep growing as a Christian?***

Whether it's reading more, praying more, learning from the example of others more, or ideally all 3. I have never enjoyed reading (something you probably don't hear too often in the 'growing as a Christian' question!) but we're trying to work on that. I've always taken more in from listening and watching than reading.

### ***Do you have a favourite Bible passage/verse?***

Romans 8:38-39. "For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor thing present or nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

### ***What do you like most about Bon Accord?***

The fellowship with so many different people.

## Annual Inter-Church Holiday Club

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Each summer, the congregations of city centre evangelical churches have the privilege of working together to run a Holiday Club for children from the local area and our church families and there is a role for you on the team:



### Team Builders

#### Team INFORMATION

Monday 13<sup>th</sup> to Friday 17<sup>th</sup> August 2018

From 9am to 1.30pm each day  
**(programme runs 10am-12.30pm)**

Team Builders is set in a Sports Club where the children (Players) will be led by the Gaffer and the Head Coach through their training to discover the value of team work and how they can become part of Jesus' team. On Day 1 we meet Joseph and learn that no matter how badly things have gone, God has a way back for us; on Day 2 we learn through Moses that we are not alone – Jesus is with us; on Day 3 we meet Esther and link her story of rescuing her people to Jesus' rescue plan for us; on Day 4, Jesus calls his disciples showing that anyone can be on his team and on Day 5 we find out about forgiveness through the story of Paul and John Mark.

Each day there are games, crafts, quizzes, songs and Bible stories all designed to help the children discover more or talk more about what they have been finding out. There is also an end-of-club special church service planned for Sunday 19<sup>th</sup>, to which all the children will be invited.

### How can you be involved?

- We are looking for 6-9 leaders who can be small group leaders - responsible for a small group of children throughout the morning and for leading the teaching time with them (discussion/worksheet time to reinforce upfront teaching.)
- We are looking for 2 crafts leaders to be in charge of themed crafts for each day (ideas provided!)

- We are looking for 2 games leaders to run games each day
- We are looking for 2 snack leaders to prepare snacks for the children during the morning
- We are looking for musicians to lead singing, and dramatists to take part in the drama each morning - you can have another role as well
- We need people to help with the practical side of things: PA, PowerPoint, registration, greeting, timekeeping etc.
- We also need 2 up-front leaders to engage and involve the children and communicate the story to them

Behind the scenes, we need folk to help with scenery and props in advance of the week, and people to provide lunch for the team each day.

## **Free Church Youth Conference – 16 to 18 March 2018**

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The Free Church Youth Conference is a weekend conference, for individuals aged sixteen to thirty, which aims to build up young Christians in their walk of faith. Through our main talks, workshops, times of prayer, corporate worship and during free time we hope to establish networks of communication and accountability between our delegates as we run the race for Christ together. The conference also provides the opportunity to invite non-Christians who will be directly confronted with the challenge and offer of the gospel. Delegates representing a variety of denominations travel across the country in order to attend the conference every year. Our main speaker in March 2018 is Iver Martin, Principal of Edinburgh Theological Seminary, who accompanied by others will lead the teaching sessions provided.

Every year a committee is appointed to coordinate the next Youth Conference. This year, the committee consists of a mix of backgrounds, vocations and gifting:

- **John Macpherson** (Bon Accord Free Church) and **Craig Angus** (Smithton Church) are overseeing and leading the work of the weekend.
- **Allan Macmillan** (Dowanvale Free Church) has created a website for the Youth Conference and is overseeing communications and any technical aspects of the weekend.
- **Christina Macmillan** (Roskeen Free Church) has been organising workshop speakers
- **Anna Macrae** (St Columba's Free Church) has been managing bookings and payments for the weekend.
- **Keith Nicolson** (Cornerstone, Edinburgh) has been working on fundraising and will be producing the conference brochure.

With such an important event in the calendar for many, we, as a committee, know time spent in prayer is always fundamental when planning and preparing the conference. We seek to implore you to join us in this prayerful ministry. For this reason we compiled a prayer list, which structures the items we would appreciate prayer for in the lead up and subsequent to the Youth Conference. We hope this prayer list can be used by congregations and individuals as we commit the weekend and its delegates before God.

**SAFETY** - Pray for safety in travel for all. Pray, too, for safety in the kitchen and in all the activities throughout the weekend.

**HEALTH AND STRENGTH** - We pray for the speakers in the final weeks, that they would be fit and well for the conference. We praise God for their time to study and prepare and hope that they will be looking forward to the conference.

**ENCOURAGEMENT** - Pray that our Christian brothers and sisters attending the conference would be encouraged by the talks, by the answered questions and by the time spent with other believers who come from various backgrounds but are united in the Gospel.

**CHALLENGE** - We want to pray for all those attending the Conference who are not Christians. We pray that the Holy Spirit would grip their hearts with the whole truth of the Gospel and that they would come to know Jesus as Saviour and Lord of their lives.

**PRAISE** - We look forward to joining together with one heart and voice and to singing songs of worship during our main sessions over the course of the weekend. Praise God for our band and for the gifts that they have been given and use.

**CHANGE** - Pray that we would be convicted by the Spirit through what has been heard, prayed, sung or spoken and that it would lead to lasting change.

**MISSION** - Pray for delegates' witness as they return to places of employment and study. Pray that the flame would not die out but in fact grow brighter as they have been reminded of the great Hope of the Gospel and the call to proclaim it.

**DELEGATES** - Pray that they would be prepared in coming to the Youth Conference and ready to hear from God's Word and apply it.

**NEXT YEAR'S COMMITTEE** - Pray that they would start as they mean to go on, in dependence on God, in prayer and in study. Pray for joy and strength in the coming year.
