## Tribute – Jean Porter

---

Jean was born in Lochinver on the west coast of Sutherland on the 2nd of May 1927. She was the second of five daughters born to John & Annie Mathieson; Jean, her older sister Catherine, and younger sisters Dorothy, Iris and Angela.

As a child she enjoyed music, singing and badminton and loved the hustle and bustle of a household not only full of sisters but also many visitors.

After leaving school she went to Glasgow to study at the West of Scotland College and, on finishing her studies, became a hotel receptionist in various Highland hotels. It was during this time that she met her future husband Ronald in Fort William and, following their marriage in 1961, she moved to Aberdeen where she became the first ever receptionist at the newly established Grampian TV. Her college studies and subsequent employment made her a stickler for good grammar and she wasn't slow to gently correct those who fell short of her exacting standards!

In 1962 the marriage was blessed with the arrival of Jane to be followed six years later by Jonathan and this was a time that Jean dedicated to the home and the care of the children.

By 1974 – with both children in school – she re-entered the world of formal employment as a secretary for the social work department at Craiginches Prison where she remained until retirement.

In time the family grew with the marriage of Jane to Kevin and of Jonathan to Karen.

In 2001 her granddaughter Emma was born – a daughter for Jonathan & Karen. She doted on Emma and they both shared a love of fashion and makeup. She was very proud of Emma's achievements at school; of which there were many. On a personal note can I just say that no visit to Jean was complete without a full update on Emma's latest achievements!

Jean also carried on the tradition of the '*lucky dip*' – begun by Ron - which involved Emma going into a cupboard full of sweeties and taking her pick.

As is evident family ties were very important to Jean and a day wouldn't go by without a phone call to Jonathan – but only after

seeing the day's episode of *Pointless*! And distance was no barrier to regular and appreciated chats with Jane half way across the world.

Jean was also close to all her sisters but perhaps particularly so with her sister Dorothy with whom she enjoyed holidays in the Mediterranean. In later years when holidays in the Med were no longer an option they would chat on a daily basis as well as their twice daily contact via Facebook – an innovation Jean embraced with great enthusiasm. In fact the Internet was a source of great fascination; to the extent that when she first connected to the internet her data quota proved quite insufficient given her regular forays into You Tube!

Family then was important to Jean, as was her faith. Jean was a longstanding member of Bon Accord Free Church and though unable for a number of years to attend services she always showed a lively interest in developments - and especially the people - in the congregation. It is on Jean's instructions that we are singing the hymn '*How great thou art*' at this service and the words of the hymn capture her own testimony to God's saving love: '*Then sings my soul my Saviour, God, to Thee. How great thou art, how great thou art*'. It is our settled conviction that she is, even now, glorying in the love and greatness of her God in heaven.

A tribute to Jean would not be complete without a reference to her elegant sophistication; she was always immaculate and never without her nails painted, and her lipstick and hair done to perfection.

In more recent years when her mobility was more restricted she enjoyed her weekly visits from family and friends and loved knitting and playing bingo at Broomhill Park; in fact a special mention should be made of all the staff at Broomhill Park who cared for her with a much appreciated friendliness and professionalism.

Earlier this year she enjoyed the grand occasion of her 90th birthday surrounded by close family and friends and just loved all the fuss that was rightly made of her.

Jean will be greatly missed and lovingly remembered.

## **Views from the Pews Chairs! – Bon Accord People**

---

Thanks to **Jason and Suzanne Chambers** who are answering our questions this month...

### ***Please tell us a little about yourself. Where are you from [and what brought you to Aberdeen]?***

I (Jason) am 36 years old and from a small Appalachian community in eastern Tennessee. I grew up attending Baptist churches occasionally. My parents taught me civility and hard work. I'm married to Suzanne who is actually from a town in Illinois, 70 miles from Chicago, but her family moved to Tennessee in 1998. I met Suzanne at my brother's wedding on July 24, 2004 - she was the photographer. We were married on October 15, 2005. We have two lovely girls named Zoë (5) and Amara (2.5). We also have three in heaven (two miscarriages and a stillborn daughter). We came to Aberdeen about a year and a half ago for me to pursue doctoral work in the New Testament.

### ***What does a typical day look like for you?***

My day starts with a little food and either coffee or tea. Then, I settle into that day's study plan. As a research student, research is my occupation. I try to put in at least 8 hours a day of reading/writing and exegetical analysis. Aside from that, I spend time with Suzanne, Zoë, and Amara.

Suzanne gets Zoë ready for school and spends the day with Amara. Days vary greatly, but are often spent with friends made from our Divinity group at the Uni.

### ***How did you become part of Bon Accord?***

Before arriving in Aberdeen, a colleague at St. Andrews introduced me to Julian who told me about Bon Accord. Once we visited, we knew it was the right place—especially when we saw that the girls felt at home.

### ***Please describe how you became a Christian?***

I was born-again at the age of 15 when I was suddenly convicted by the Spirit. Through the witness of sermons I'd heard and friends, I began to see that I was condemned and could not do anything to save myself. At that point, I saw the need for salvation in Christ through his death and

resurrection. I can affirm that my trust in Jesus is the result of the Spirit's regenerative work. In the months following this, I picked up a Bible and started reading it for all it was worth and developed such a love for the Word that has propelled me to my present research –Hence, my strong conservative convictions that biblical scholarship, rightly done, is done in faith. I know that I would not be doing what I'm doing without the Spirit to guide me in my study. I was ordained to the ministry in 2013. I have served as an associate pastor, interim pastor, and adjunct hermeneutics professor as well as been asked to fill various administrative roles.

When Suzanne was 15, her family moved to Tennessee. Her family began attending church regularly when she was 16. She had an amazing pastor who led her to Christ, not only through his sermons but through the way he lived. He had a passion for Christ like she had never seen before. He would talk to her about God, but he never pushed her to make a decision. He would simply ask her if God had spoken to her yet. She came to a place where she realised she knew she needed a relationship with the Lord. The Lord made it clear to her that she was a sinner in desperate need of a Saviour. She gave her life to Christ in 1999 at the age of 17.

### ***How do you try to keep growing as a Christian?***

From a human standpoint, I think spiritual growth boils down to one's attitude as a disciple –learning utter dependence on the Spirit and a growing sensitivity to the Word, for example. Staying sensitive requires constant communication with the Lord through prayer and reflection on biblical truth. Growth consists of maintaining a posture of deep dependence and trust in the Lord, especially when life becomes unsteady. I will be the first to admit that I yet have much room for growth in these things.

### ***Do you have a favourite Bible passage/verse?***

My favourite bible verses have changed with every season of life. Soon after I was saved, my favourite Bible verse was Philippians 1:6 in my growing desire to know the Lord. Later on, it was Galatians 2:20 (which I still love). More recently, I've appreciated passages dealing with the wisdom of seeking a God-directed path such as Proverbs 3:5–6 and 16:2–3. I've come to appreciate these verses more as a result of having to lean on the Lord for understanding and guidance during a challenging

period of life. Our sense of calling to Aberdeen (and perhaps Scotland) has come out of prayerful reflection on passages such as these.

Proverbs 31:25 is Suzanne's favourite for the season we are in.

### ***What do you like most about Bon Accord?***

We wanted to be in a place that was hospitable, holds the Word of God with honour, and is Spirit-led. It certainly has the feel of a church family to us as well.
